After experiencing a community tour in September, MMES staff committed to developing a school-wide project that embedded curricular competencies and content in local resources and history. This January, Colin Cartwright, a local senior and historian, began working with each class. He is coming weekly to tell stories of growing up in Canal Flats and presenting grade appropriate information about paddleboats (K-1), water systems (2-3) logging (3/4/5), and mining (5/6/7). Each class is working with Mr. Cartwright on a project related to their learning and plans to present their work to the public during Canal Days (annual community festival) in the spring.
